
1st Reading; Jeremiah 31:31—34 I will write my Law in their hearts

Penitential Act - we ask for forgiveness together Tues 26th at 7pm. Can you help with a cuppa afterwards?


Ecumenical services in Holy week; we are hosts on Wed 27th, 7pm; come and be the Christian people in Holy Week.
