Archdiocesan Lourdes Pilgrimage 12th - 19th July. Go as a pilgrim or as one of the sick? See poster in the porch with details

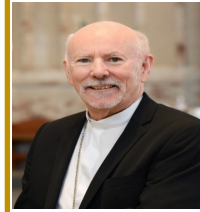
