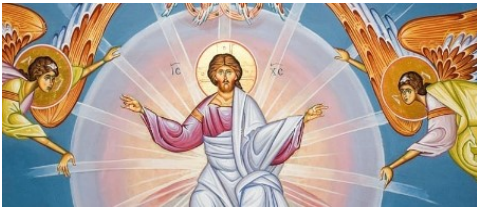

May is the month of Mary, especially in her parish! Unbroken novena from May 11th until Pentecost Sunday. Novena books & intention notes now available. The daily rosary stopped during Covid19 - maybe it's time to bring it back again?

Ascension Thursday - holyday of obligation - is this week. Vigil on Wednesday and mass at 10am Thursday. School masses will also be celebrated during the day.



From Glasgow to Gaza. Read the full declaration signed by Archbishop Nolan and the Moderator of the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland to mark the visit of Gaza's only Catholic priest to Glasgow, standing in solidarity all in the Holy Land and calling for peace: www.sciaf.org.

No UK arms to Israel. The UK government claims it has a robust arms export licensing system but has now admitted

that it has not reviewed whether Israel is committing violations of international humanitarian law since 29th January, whilst arms exports have continued: www.caat.org/news.

Deportation to Rwanda. The Scottish Refugee Council is deeply concerned by reports of Home Office plans to detain people seeking asylum ahead of the implementation of removals to Rwanda under this unjust scheme; full update plus details of free helpline: www.scottishrefugeecouncil.org.

Don't put Britain on the nuclear front line. US nuclear weapons are returning to the UK for the first time since 2008; call on the UK government to reject US nuclear weapons at any site in the UK and do everything possible to defuse international tensions; sign CND's letter: www.cnduk.org.

Global health improvements. In 1990 the global child mortality rate was 9.3% but had declined to 3.7% by 2021 thanks to improvements in public health systems, meaning 132 million children who would have died survived; facts at: www.ourworldindata.org/children-saved-global-health.
