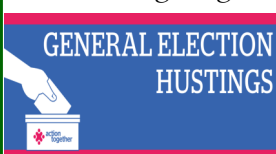

Peters Pence is taken up next week June 29/30) to support the personal charitable aid the Pope dispenses to the worlds poorest. It is NOT for the Vatican!

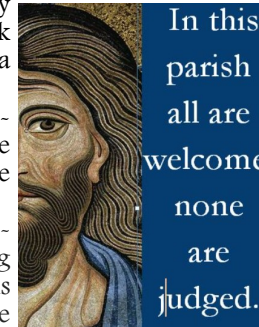
