LECTIONARY

The Lectionary, the book of the Scripture readings for Mass & the Sacraments, is changing as part of the process of revising the translations of books used in church. Roman Missal was revised in 2011 (Fr Jim is still challenged by its clunky English!) and other texts continue revision. The new Lectionary uses the English Standard Version (Catholic Edition) of the Bible. The changes are intended to make the translations more faithful to the original languages, biblical scholarship, and provide a text for use at Mass that is more "proclaimable" and, hopefully, more inclusive. 2 things we need to consider. We will need a gathering of our readers in the autumn to discuss how this affects them; also a good time to look for more readers. We will need to purchase the Lectionary & Gospel Book - they come into force on the 1st Sunday in Advent 2024. (estimated cost of new editions is £1,400!)

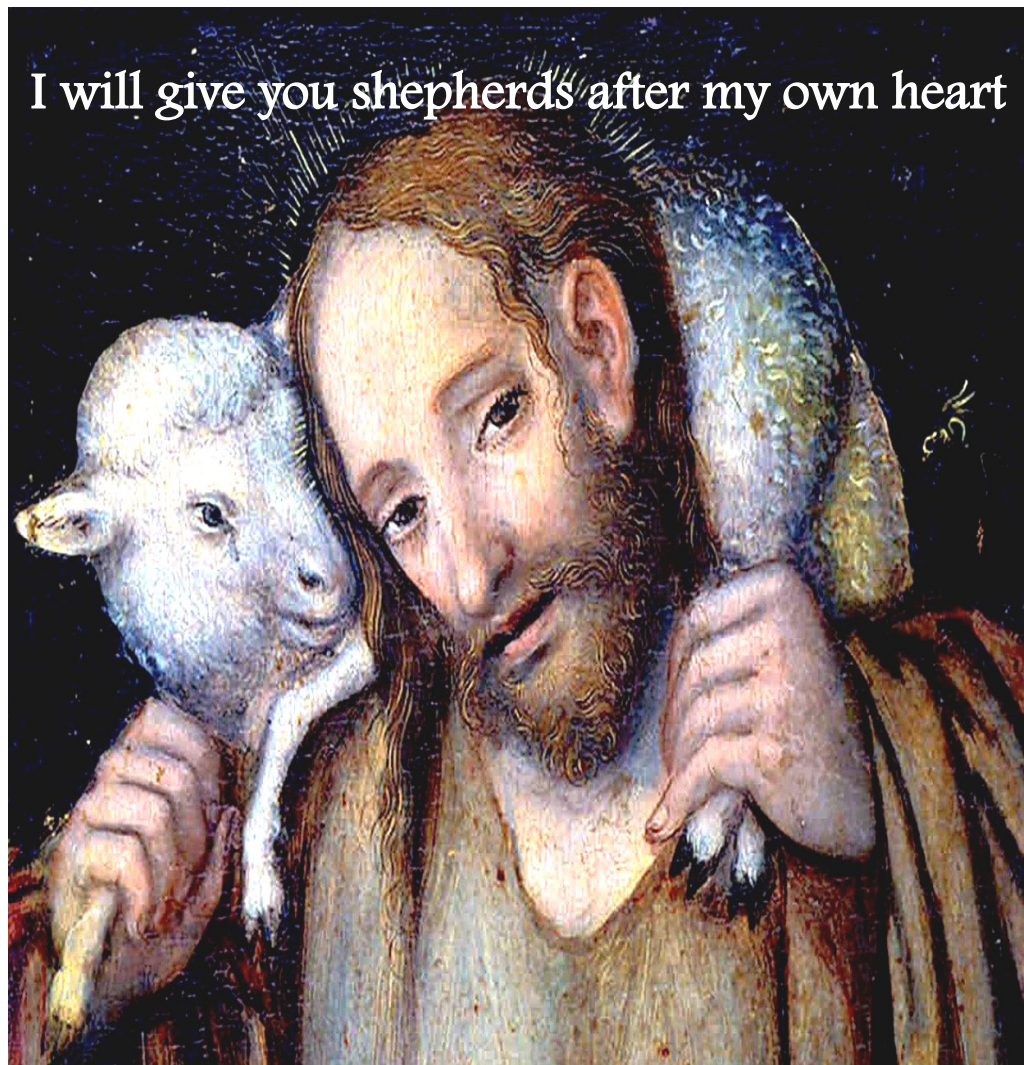

LITURGY OF THE WORD

16TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

1st Reading; Jeremiah 23: 1 - 6

I will gather together the remnant of the flock and raise up shepherds for them

St John Paul II wrote on the life of priests, inspired by the imagery of 'good shepherds' used in today's Mass. However, it speaks to all Christians.

Of special importance is the capacity to relate to others. This is truly fundamental for a person who is called to be responsible for a community. This demands that the (Christian) not be arrogant, or quarrelsome, but affable, hospitable, sincere in words and heart, prudent and discreet, generous and ready to serve, capable of opening themselves to clear and human relationships

and of encouraging the same in others, quick to understand, forgive and console. People today are often trapped in situations of standardization and loneliness, especially in large urban centres, and they become ever more appreciative of the value of community. Today this is one of the most eloquent signs and one of the most effective ways of transmitting the Gospel message. (Adapted PDV 43)

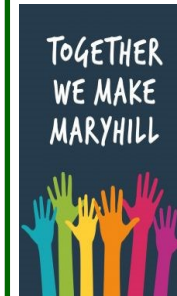
