17th SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

The Gospel is the famous story of the feeding of the five thousand. Key to the story is the little boy who has a tiny offering. He hands it over and it becomes enough - more than enough. The miracle is a pointer to the Eucharist when Jesus gives us himself - more than enough for all our hungers. But what about you? What's your offering - your gift, for the life of the parish and the community? Are you as generous as this child in the gospel?

18th Sunday of Ordinary Time

Last week, we saw Jesus feed the hungry crowd and now they're following him. They've kind of missed the message - he isn't 'meals on wheels'! He's teaching them that his message - food for the soul and for our way of life - is more important than having a full stomach. We too need to learn that faith, following Jesus is a challenge; but ultimately it feeds & nourishes us on the deepest journey - life's journey!

19th SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

After 2 weeks of hearing about miraculous feeding and the crowds amazement we now hear the intense language of John chapter 6—the "discourse on the bread of life". It is a difficult and challenging chapter but it is also intimately connected to our faith which is centred in the Eucharist. At Mass Jesus gives us himself - his very self - sacramentally. He comes as bread for YOU. Do you trust in him?
