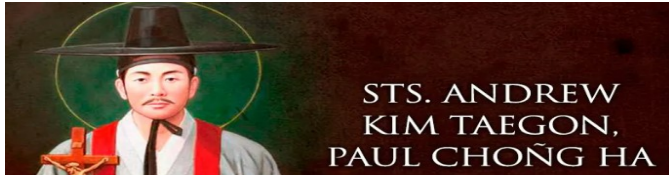

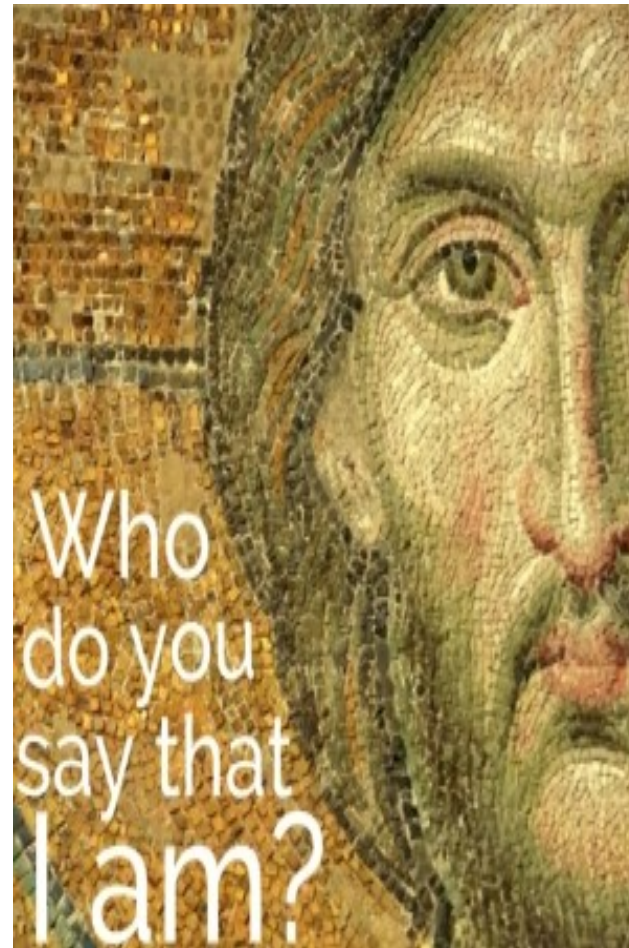

End the war in Ukraine.

Ukraine war - serious global dangers, with escalation heightening the risk of nuclear conflict; ask the PM to work to bring all parties to negotiation, implement the Minsk agreement @ cnd.eaction.org.uk/EndConflictUkraine.



Universal credit. Social security system does not provide enough to cover cost of life's essentials; email your MP to ask the Chancellor asking her to introduce a protected minimum floor in Universal Credit; action.trusselltrust.org/autumnbudget.

Rosebank update - good news. UK government wont fight legal challenge against decision to grant consent to drill in untapped oil & gas fields off Shetland & Aberdeen after a Supreme Court ruling assessing the impact of new wells: <https://foe.scot>.

All refugees & asylum seekers welcome.

Help for asylum seekers - bad news. The Scottish government has scrapped plans to introduce free bus travel for asylum seekers in a nationwide pilot of the scheme for those who cannot work under UK immigration rules citing the need to "constrain all but essential" spending: <https://foe.scot>.

Protect Scotland's deep seas. In 2014 parts of our seas were designated as offshore marine protected areas, yet they are still being trawled destructively; tell the Scottish government to put tailored fisheries restrictions in place by the end of 2025; <https://scotlink.eaction.online/deepseas>.
