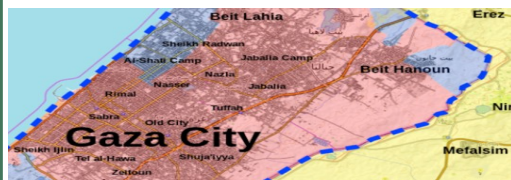

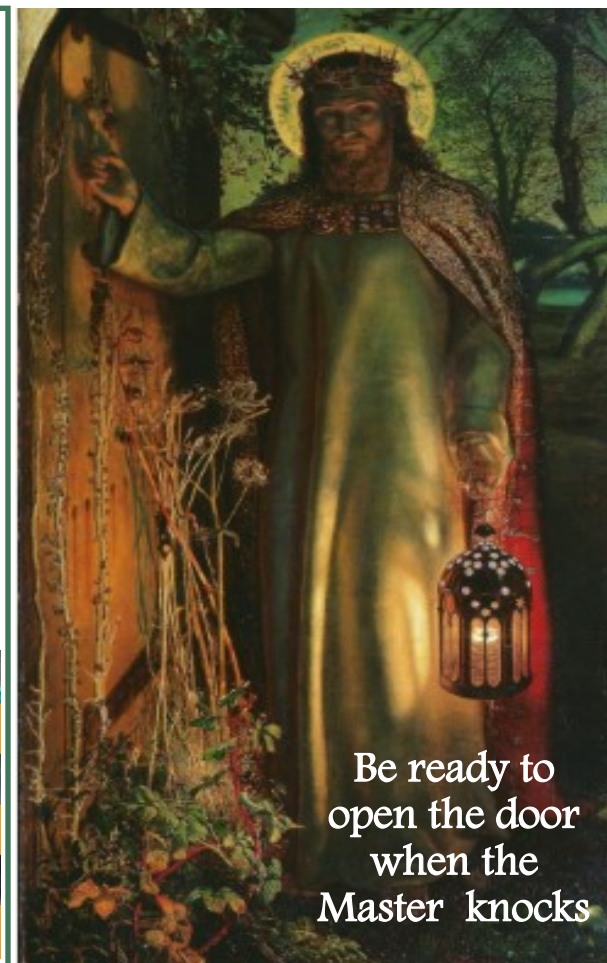

St. Maximilian Kolbe - Franciscan Friar died in place of a married man with a family in Auschwitz. Kolbe had a deep devotion to the Immaculate Conception. He founded the 'Knights of the Immaculate' and also a huge friary near Warsaw called Niepokalanów—'Immaculate-town'. He was cremated on the Assumption, August 15th. When we eventually install stained glass here we will commemorate him in it!

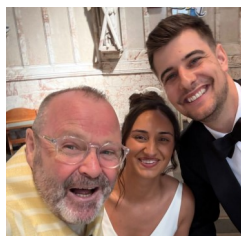
Parish News
