Big thanks to William Collins who (again!) repaired the kerbing at entrance to car park. And to Pat Lally who came and tidied up the garden and grounds after the storm!

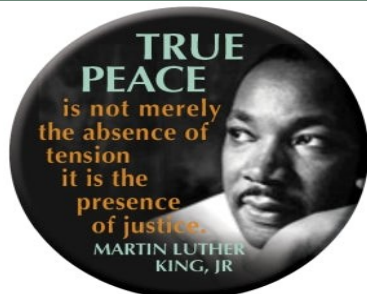
