**No Forests, No Future.** As huge swathes of the Amazon are being burned down world leaders are about to gather at COP30, in the heart of the Amazon; the UK must push for a clear global plan to finally end deforestation: info & petition: <https://action.greenpeace.org.uk/protect-the-amazon>.

**Turn Debt into Hope.** Unsustainable public debt strips poor countries of the ability to provide health care, education or climate mitigation; press for cancellation of unjust debts, reform of the global financial system and a new UN led debt framework; petition: <https://turndebtintohope.caritas.org>.

**End Child Poverty.** Access the latest research on child poverty in the UK that shows 23% of children in Scotland live in relative poverty (31% in Glasgow North – 17% in Mid-Dun); the end of the two child benefit cap here next year cannot come too soon; read up: <https://endchildpoverty.org.uk>.

**Make Space for Nature.** Looking after nature is good for us, the planet and wildlife; eleven ideas for the autumn – starts with allowing vegetation to dieback naturally, leave twigs and leaves for insects to shelter and leave seedheads for birds: Make Space For Nature - Autumn Tips | NatureScot.

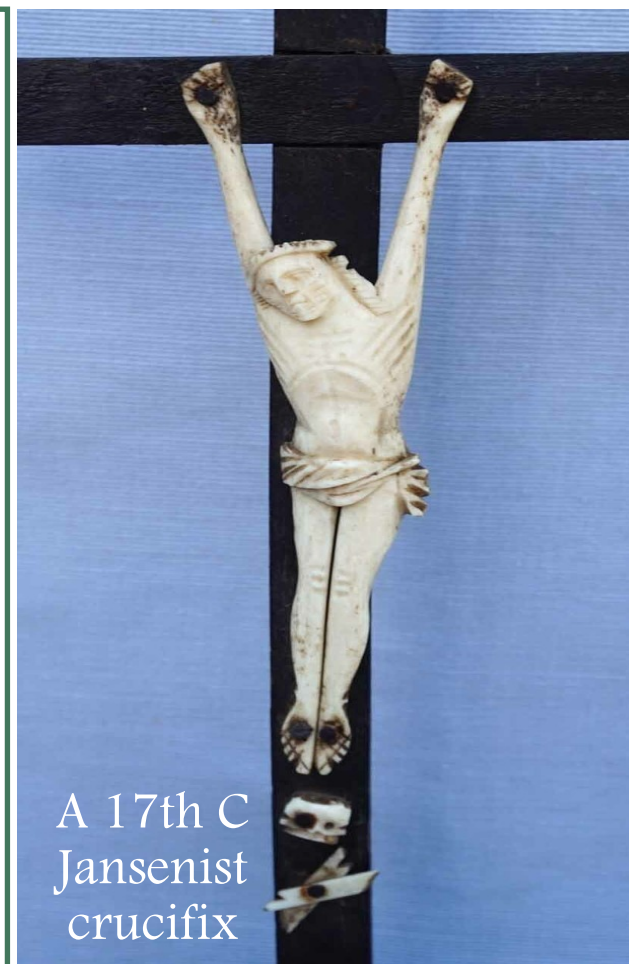
