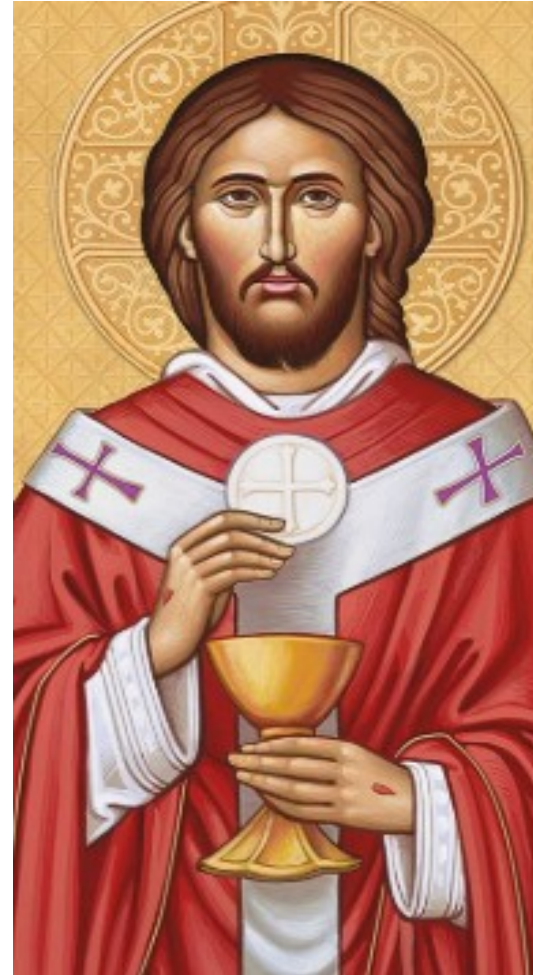

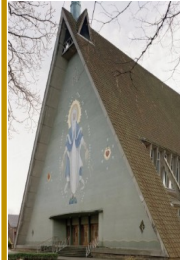

(£9,700) Both gables need repointing & (defunct) chimneys blocked. (£12k) Ceiling of one room on 3rd floor has come in from water damage.
